Kamouraska Anne Hébert, 1973 The Art and Genius of Anne Hébert Janis L. Pallister, 2001 This book shows through criticism the richness the complexity and the far reaching significance of the writings of Anne Hébert the Quebecan novelist and poet who first achieved recognition in the 1940s and 50s The writings by such notables as Gaetan Brulotte Neil Bishop Annabelle Rea Lori Saint Martin Roseanna Dufault and many others are variously in English and in French Prefaced by renowned Hébertian scholar Janet Pallister and introduced by Pallister's essay on the life and accomplishment of Anne Hébert the work is accompanied by a large bibliography of the works of Anne Hébert Where Are the Voices Coming From?, 2021-10-18 This collection of essays focuses on Canadian history and its legacies as represented in novels and films in English and French produced in Canada mainly in the 1980s and 1990s The approach is both cross cultural and interdisciplinary aiming at articulating Canadian differences through a comparison of anglophone and francophone cultures illustrated by works treating some of the different groups which make up Canadian society English Canadian Québécois Acadian Native and ethnic minorities The emphasis is on the problematic representation of Canadianness which is closely bound up with constructions of history and its legacies dispossession criminality nomadism Gothicism the Maritime The English French language difference is emblematic of Canadian difference the two part arrangement with one section on Literature and the other on Film sets up the pattern of relationships between the two forms of cultural representation that these essays explore Essays in the Literature section are on single texts by such writers as Margaret Atwood Tomson Highway Ann Marie MacDonald Anne Michaels and Alice Munro Gabrielle Roy Anne Hébert Antonine Maillet Bernard Assiniwi and Régine Robin The Film section with its mirror structure both supplements and amplifies this dialogue extending notions of Canadianness with its emphasis on voices from Quebec and Acadia traditionally othered in Canadian history Filmmakers treated include Phillip Borsos Atom Egoyan Ted Kotcheff Morton Ransen and Vincent Ward Denys Arcand Gilles Carle Alanis Obomsawin Léa Pool and Jacques Savoie Women and Narrative Identity Mary Jean Matthews Green, 2001 A feminist re-reading of the Quebec literary tradition from Laure Conan and Gabrielle Roy to contemporary figures such as France Thoret and Régine Robin **The Quebec Anthology, 1830-1990** Matt Cohen, Wayne Grady, 1996 The Quebec Anthology 1830-1990 provides a complete overview of the Quebec short story from its beginnings to the 1990s and offers a unique opportunity for English readers to discover the essence of this fascinating literature In addition a detailed biography of each author and an assessment of each story's place in the larger canvas of Quebec literature are included Published in English **Anne Hébert** Delbert W. Certain Difficulty of Being Anthony Purdy, 1990-06-01

In the Preface to *A Certain Difficulty of Being* Purdy examines the kinds of discourse that deal with the novel in some nineteenth century Quebec novel prefaces thereby revealing a theme of generic denegation in the sense of "This is not a novel." Purdy goes on to explore the transition from epic to novel in Félix Antoine Savard's *Menaud maître draveur* the contradictions stemming from the use of a first person present tense narrative in André Langevin's *Poussières sur la ville* the problem of narrativity and history as it is raised in Hubert Aquin's *Prochain épisode* and the way in which narrative voice functions in Anne Hébert's *Kamouraska*. He also touches on the current debate concerning the boundaries between modernism and post modernism. Purdy does not offer an all embracing system to explain the development of narrative in the Quebec novel but leads us to an understanding of how these particular novels function each in its own socio historical context and how they achieve or fail to achieve what they set out to do. The thread that runs through the different chapters is a pragmatic concern with Quebec's historical difficulty of being as it informs in varying ways the narrative projects of the novels in question.

McPherson, 2021-09-14 Maintaining that women's storytelling is a telling activity Karen McPherson reads for guilt in novels by five twentieth century writers Simone de Beauvoir L'Invitée Marguerite Duras Le ravissement de Lol V Stein Anne Hébert Kamouraska Virginia Woolf Mrs Dalloway and Nicole Brossard Le désert mauve She finds in the vocabulary and atmosphere of these novels a linking of female protagonists to crime and culpability The guilt however is not clearly imputed or assumed it tends to trouble the conscience of the entire narrative Through critical close readings and an inquiry into the interrelations among narration transgression and gender McPherson explores how the women in the stories come under suspicion and how they attempt to reverse or rewrite the guilty sentence The author examines the complex process and language of incrimination reflecting on its literary philosophical social and political manifestations in the texts and contexts of the five novels She looks for signs of possible subversion of the incriminating process within the texts Can female protagonists and women writers escape the vicious circling of the story that would incriminate them In the course of this book the stories are made to reveal their strikingly modern and postmodern preoccupations with survival *Canadian Film and Video* Loren R.
