Panama Odyssey William J. Jorden,2014-03-01 The Panama Canal Treaties of 1977 were the most significant foreign policy achievement of the Carter administration Most Latin American nations had regarded the 1903 treaty and its later minor modifications as vestiges of American colonialism and obstacles to

any long term stable relationship with the United States Hence at a time when conflicts were mushrooming in Central America the significance of the new Panama treaties cannot be overestimated Former Ambassador to Panama William J Jorden has provided the definitive account of the long and often contentious negotiations that produced those treaties It is a vividly written reconstruction of the complicated process that began in 1964 and ended with ratification of the new pacts in 1978 Based on his personal involvement behind the scenes in the White House 1972 1974 and in the United States Embassy in Panama 1974 1978 Jorden has produced a unique living history Access to documents and the personalities of both governments and equally important Jorden s personal recollections of participants on both sides make this historical study an incomparable document of U S foreign relations Beyond the singular story of the treaties themselves and how diplomats negotiate in the modern world is the rare description of how the United States deals with a major foreign policy problem How does a superpower cope with a tiny nation that happens to occupy a strategically critical position And how does the U S Senate face up to its constitutionally assigned power to advise and consent Once treaties are approved does the House of Representatives help or hinder Panama Odyssey also deals with another crucial element in the shaping of policy public opinion how is it informed or led astray In sum this is a history a handbook on diplomacy a course in government and a revelation of foreign policy in action all based on a fascinating and controversial episode in the U S experience *Army RD & A Bulletin* ,1999 *Dixie Heretic* Tennant McWilliams,Tennant S. McWilliams,2023-09-22 Dixie Heretic is a life and times biography of the minister and social reformer Renwick C Kennedy 1900 1985 an impassioned tortured man who strove ardently to make his white Alabama congregants more Christian by acknowledging their own racism and greed and who not only lived but chronicled carefully many of the forces culminating in the right wing conservative movement today As McWilliams relates Kennedy came from upcountry South Carolina a place rife with Scotch Irish Associate Reformed Presbyterians They lived by biblical infallibility and a strain of individual piety and salvation focused on the hereafter In the early 1920s however his ministerial studies took him to Princeton Theological Seminary There he encountered the Presbyterian Conflict over science fundamentalism and the social gospel and he emerged a radical Christian socialist Like a few other articulate practitioners of Neo orthodoxy young Kennedy stayed true to the literalist Bible and the salvation and piety allegiances of his youth But he embraced not only the Social Gospel s mandate to solve earthly problems of poverty and prejudice but many cardinal tenets of modern science as well To Kennedy this posed no contradiction In 1927 Kennedy moved to Camden Alabama the seat of Wilcox County where he soon married and started a family Meanwhile his ministry for social change dominated his Wilcox pastorates filled with the very people from whom he derived the Scotch Irish Quietly he came to believe that God had a mandate for him to confront and change the behaviors and beliefs of his congregations notably their attitudes about race and poverty And to do this he found he had to attack what he considered traditionalist Christian hypocrisy half Christianity or non social gospel Christianity some of which he came to see as a form of proto

fascism if not fascism itself He soon turned to penning confrontational short stories many published in Christian Century and some in the New Republic and set in his fictitious Yaupon County In some of these stories he overtly revealed his allegiances as a Social Gospel Christian and as an adamant supporter of Franklin Roosevelt s Democratic party He spared no one not even members of his own congregation He also abandoned his pacifism and urged US intervention in World War II he hoped that the defeat of racial fascism abroad might somehow grow white hearts at home Ultimately to help eliminate the anti Christ the mad dog Hitler Kennedy joined the U S Army As a chaplain with the famed 102nd Evacuation Hospital he experienced some of the most horrific chapters of the conflict Saint Lo the Battle of the Bulge and arrived at Dachau a mere week after German soldiers fled The postwar world gave Kennedy periods of optimism and hope He returned from the war believing America might deal with its own racial issues the way it had treated Europe and Japan s His own children grew into educated enlightened and thriving adults And new developments in his professional life brought considerable increases to his family income easing his wife s long financial insecurities Yet these years also offered a great many frustrations Even by 1948 he knew his Social Gospel hopes about racism fascism and white entitlement especially among his fellow Scotch Irish were na ve at best The rise of the Dixiecrat movement a key Dixiecrat leader Alabama State senator J Miller Bonner was a member of his own congregation only deepened his sense of personal defeat Even so the rise of the civil rights movement in the 1950s and 1960s and occasional developments in state and national politics rekindled at least some of his old Neo orthodox hope and drive He played a significant role in desegregating Troy State University for instance but the gratifications of even small victories proved fleeting dashed by the assassinations of Dr King JFK and RFK and the growing numbers of southern white Republicans and Wallaceites In Kennedy s increasing down times he was privately the self professed Christian and a Democrat seeing national Republicans as sinners for their growing embrace of white southern racial conservatives A long term functional alcoholic this privately persistent Neo orthodox Christian never ceased agonizing over the growing half Christianity around him Indeed he died worrying about what it portended for the role of white supremacist proto fascists in modern America aware of having made few inroads on God s mandate and what he considered white Christian wrongs in Alabama While Renwick Kennedy was front loaded for the failure he indeed found still in the values and social norms he pondered and challenged at every stage of his life and today so badly in need of recommitment he stands as a good citizen a non hypocritical Christian and an emblem of hope

Larry Ritchie Williams,2017-11-23 Colonel Larry Williams spent twenty seven years in the United States Marine Corps commanding ten units and organizations while serving from Japan and Vietnam to Moscow and Beirut Here is his account It started by a chance discovery and years later was dramatically reoriented by a coin toss As the high school class of 1953 anticipated graduation they chatted in the hallways exchanging ideas about future plans His afternoon and Saturday jobs during high school did not provide enough money for college One day while changing classes he observed a booklet on his homeroom teacher's desk that described the NROTC as how one might earn a commission in the United States Navy and even compete for a college scholarship It contained an application Upon graduation from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill four years later he was commissioned a second lieutenant in the Marine Corps preparing to serve the obligated four years payback for his free education It seemed like a good plan but life often has little respect for planning Within three years he was on Okinawa separated from his wife and their two newborns for a thirteen month deployment On his return he joined the faculty at the Army Artillery and Missile School Then it was another thirteen months away this time in Vietnam Reassigned to Frankfurt Germany he commanded Marine Security Guards in twenty seven diplomatic posts in Europe including six behind the Iron Curtain Upon graduation from the Armed Forces Staff College in Norfolk he and a classmate were informed by Headquarters Marine Corps that they both were to be reassigned to WestPac western pacific for a year with one going to Okinawa and the other to Vietnam Headquarters asked for their preferences Both wanted to return to Vietnam He lost the coin toss and it was back to Okinawa That coin toss was to significantly restructure his career and his life The subsequent years included managing the security at the Naval Air Station Alameda California made turbulent by the prevailing civil rights and antiwar environment contributing to the Marine Corps becoming the only military service to support every dollar spent with explicit cost benefit analysis in spite of opposition by the Army and the DoD fielding a totally new light armor combat capability into the Marine Corps with an innovative acquisition program completing within budget and only 2.25 years from concept to production conducting Arctic exercises in North Norway including a night amphibious landing unseen by Russians just a mountain range away in Murmansk commanding the largest artillery organization in the world and trying unsuccessfully to contribute to a peaceful resolution to conflict in Lebanon in 1983 [>Assassin's Creed< in the Classroom](#) Erik Champion,Juan Francisco Hiriart Vera,2023-12-18 The open world role playing Assassin's Creed video
