audience First Cover of The Outlook newspaper Washington was a controversial figure in his own lifetime and W E B Du Bois among others criticized some of his views The book was however a best seller and remained the most popular African American autobiography until that of Malcolm X In 1998 the Modern Library listed the book at No 3 on its list of the 100 best nonfiction books of the 20th century and in 1999 it was also listed by the conservative Intercollegiate Review as one of the 50 Best Books of the Twentieth Century Up from Slavery chronicles more than forty years of Washington s life from slave to schoolmaster to the face of southern race relations In this text Washington climbs the social ladder through hard manual labor a decent education and relationships with great people Throughout the text he stresses the importance of education for the black population as a reasonable tactic to ease race relations in the South particularly in the context of Reconstruction

Booker Taliaferro Washington April 5 1856 November 14 1915 was an American educator author orator and advisor to presidents of the United States Between 1890 and 1915 Washington was the dominant leader in the African American community Washington was from the last generation of black American leaders born into slavery and became the leading voice of the former slaves and their descendants They were newly oppressed in the South by disenfranchisement and the Jim Crow discriminatory laws enacted in the post Reconstruction Southern states in the late 19th and early 20th centuries Washington was a key proponent of African American businesses and one of the founders of the National Negro Business League
