History of Literature in Canada Reingard M. Reid, 2017-10-09 Including contributions from leading scholars in the field from both Australia and North America this collection explores diverse approaches to writing the lives of historians and ways of assessing the importance of doing so Beginning with the writing of autobiographies by historians the volume then turns to biographical studies both of historians whose writings were in some sense nation defining and those who may be regarded as having had a major influence on defining the discipline of history The final section explores elements of collective biography linking these to the formation of historical networks A concluding essay by Barbara Caine offers a critical appraisal of the study of historians biographies and autobiographies to date and maps out likely new directions for future work *Clio's Lives* is a very good scholarly collection that advances the study of autobiography and biography within the writing of history itself taking theoretical questions in significant new directions The contributors are well known and highly respected in the history profession and write with an insight and intellectual energy that will ensure the book has considerable impact They examine cutting edge issues about the writing of history at the personal level through autobiography and biography in diverse and innovative ways Together the writers have provided

Writing in Dust Jenny Kerber, 2011-03-17 *Writing in Dust* is the first sustained study of prairie Canadian literature from an ecocritical perspective Drawing on recent scholarship in environmental theory and criticism Jenny Kerber considers the ways in which prairie writers have negotiated processes of ecological and cultural change in the region from the early twentieth century to the present The book begins by proposing that current environmental problems in the prairie region can be understood by examining the longstanding tendency to describe its diverse terrain in dualistic terms either as an idyllic natural space or as an irredeemable wasteland It inquires into the sources of stories that naturalize ecological prosperity and hardship and investigates how such narratives have been deployed from the period of colonial settlement to the present It then considers the ways in which works by both canonical and more recent writers ranging from Robert Stead W O Mitchell and Margaret Laurence to Tim Lilburn Louise Halfe and Thomas King consistently challenge these dualistic landscape myths proposing alternatives for the development of more ecologically just and sustainable relationships among people and between humans and their physical environments *Writing in Dust* asserts that reading environmentally can help us to better understand a host of issues facing prairie inhabitants today including the environmental impacts of industrial agriculture resource extraction climate change shifting urban rural demographics the significance of Indigenous understandings of human nature relationships and the complex often contradictory meanings of eco cultural metaphors of alien invasiveness hybridity and wildness

to achieve various literary effects It describes how texts might be shaped by child usage and speculates that adult artists often find themselves surprised and informed by the child language they seek to create Ricou examines how the distinctive features of child language described by psycholinguists intersect with the written languages used by writers to suggest not only a child language but also the way a child sees and organizes an understanding of the world The book s subtitle putting the term child language into the plural points out that not one but many written interpretations of the child s perspectives are possible In order to emphasize this plurality and indicate that there are any number of child languages the author has organized his study as a series of closely related essays Each chapter considers the work of a Canadian author or authors with the book as a whole moving from the more conventional writers to those who step outside the bounds of convention Ricou proposes analogies with Wordsworth and Dylan Thomas Proust and Dickens but he finds his principal subject in the inherent interest of for example the Piagetian scheme that W O Mitchell seems to adopt in Who Has Seen the Wind the obsessions with similes in Ernest Buckler the variations on the Bildungsroman in Margaret Laurence and Alice Munro and the persistent experiments with presymbolic language in Bill Bissett For these and other writers such as Clark Blaise Emily Carr Dennis Lee Dorothy Livesay P K Page James Reaney and Miriam Waddington Ricou illuminates the particular literary languages appropriate to each author s subject The result is a fascinating and unique approach to Canadian literature

Canadian Plains Research Center, 2006 Myth has played an important and ongoing role in the development of Saskatchewan s political economy First during the time of the National Policy Saskatchewan was portrayed to immigrants as a promised land This period served as the psychological and economic foundation for the province When belief in Saskatchewan as a promised land was shattered by the Great Depression and Dirty Thirties the myth was reconstituted through the inspiration of the social gospel It was then politically reinvigorated in the meaning of medicare and has been expressed in recent decades through the competing visions for economic development Through all these eras no matter what the tides of politics there remained one constant the singular collective idea that Saskatchewan was a special place with unrealized potential The challenge for the public dialogue of Saskatchewan as the province enters its second century is to not replay the mistakes of the past Saskatchewan people must recognize the role that myth has played and must continue to play in the life of the province But at the same time they must differentiate it from reality by understanding the power of myth as a force for progress and its potential to create false expectations **As for Sinclair Ross** David Stouck, 2005-01-01 Sinclair Ross 1908 1996 best known for his canonical novel As for Me and My House 1941 and for such familiar short stories as The Lamp at Noon and The Painted Door is an elusive figure in Canadian literature A master at portraying the hardships and harsh beauty of the Prairies during the Great Depression Ross nevertheless received only modest attention from the public during his lifetime His reluctance to give readings or interviews further contributed to this faint public perception of the man In As for Sinclair Ross David Stouck tells the story of a lonely childhood in rural Saskatchewan of a long and unrewarding career in a bank and of many failed attempts to be published and to find an audience The book also tells the story of a man who fell in love with both men and women and who wrote from a position outside any single definition of gender and sexuality Stouck s biography draws on archival records and on insights gathered during an acquaintance late in Ross s life to illuminate this difficult author describing in detail the struggles of a gifted artist living in an inhospitable time and place Stouck argues that when Ross was writing about prairie farmers and small towns he wanted his readers to see the kind of society they were creating to feel uncomfortable with religion as coercive rhetoric prejudices based on race and ethnicity and rigid notions of gender As for Sinclair Ross is the story of a remarkable writer whose works continue to challenge us and are rightly considered classics of Canadian literature

Unnamed Country Dick Harrison, 1977 Americans have an idea of what the Great Plains did to the people who settled there but know little about the analogous process north of the 49th parallel or how it was reflected in fiction Dick Harrison s Unnamed Country fills this gap Harrison traces the varying literary responses to the Canadian prairies from the bewilderment of the first English speaking visitors who saw the country in essentially negative terms no wood no water down to the contemporary novelists who are employing sophisticated modern fictional techniques to reinterpret the whole experience from a new perspective Between these two ends of the literary continuum he finds the early writers of fiction too loaded down with what he calls excess cultural baggage brought from Britain or eastern Canada to see the country as it was the early twentieth century writers bemused by the myth of the garden who portrayed the prairies subdued and fruitful the prairie realists of the 1920s and 1930s akin to O E Rolvaag in their tragic view and their contemporaries the popular novelists who depicted the pioneering process in more affirmative tones

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
