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Barbarian Migrations and the Roman West, 376-568 Guy Halsall, 2007-12-20 This is a major survey of the barbarian migrations and their role in the fall of the Roman Empire and the creation of early medieval Europe one of the key events in European history Unlike previous studies it integrates historical and archaeological evidence and discusses Britain Ireland mainland Europe and North Africa demonstrating that the Roman Empire and its neighbours were inextricably linked A narrative account of the turbulent fifth and early sixth centuries is followed by a description of society and politics during the migration period and an analysis of the mechanisms of settlement and the changes of identity Guy Halsall reveals that the creation and maintenance of kingdoms and empires was impossible without the active involvement of people in the communities of Europe and North Africa He concludes that contrary to most opinions the fall of the Roman Empire produced the barbarian migrations not vice versa Barbarian Migrations and the Roman West, 376-568 Guy Halsall, 2007

Usurpers in the Later Roman Empire Adrastus Omissi, 2018 One of the great maxims of history is that it is written by the victors and nowhere does this find greater support than in the later Roman Empire Between 284 and 395 AD no fewer than 37 men claimed imperial power though today we recognize barely half of these men as legitimate rulers and more than two thirds died at their subjects hands Once established in power a new ruler needed to publicly legitimate himself and to discredit his predecessor overt criticism of the new regime became high treason with historians suppressing their accounts for fear of reprisals and the very names of defeated emperors chiselled from public inscriptions and deleted from official records In a period of such chaos how can we ever hope to record in any fair or objective way the history of the Roman state
